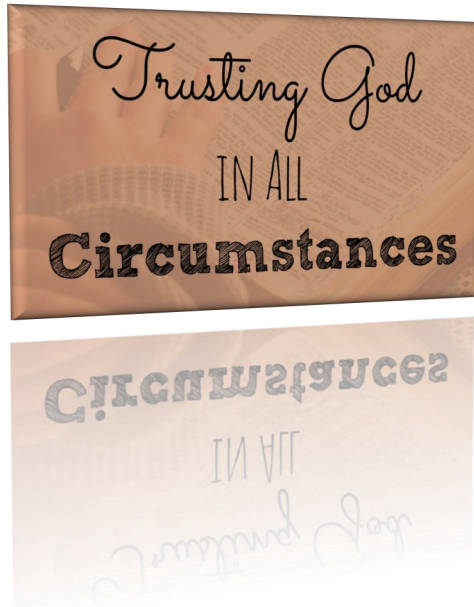

He knew that he had power to direct his own men to do whatever he wished and that he could give these orders from long range. He had told these messengers to tell Jesus that he knew it was unnecessary for HIM to come further. That power of HIS spoken word would be sufficient. The centurion *expected great things*.

Jesus was moved by this show of faith. HE healed the boy from a distance. HE could have operated at any distance.

When we pray to God, the results obtained depend upon our faith. We may be sure that God has the power to accomplish any good thing. We may be sure also that HE will always do us good. When we pray we must *expect great things*.

**Did You Know .... Glaucoma** is the leading cause of irreversible blindness. Moreover, among African American and Latino populations, glaucoma is more prevalent. Glaucoma is 6 to 8 times more common in African Americans than Caucasians. Currently, more than 3 million people in the United States have glaucoma. The National Eye Institute projects this number will reach 4.2 million by 2030, a 58 percent increase. Glaucoma is called "the sneak thief of sight" since there are no symptoms and once vision is lost, it's permanent. As much as 40% of vision can be lost without a person noticing.
