

REVIEW QUESTIONS (Lessons 1 – 10)

LESSON 1: Tough Choices / First Things First

MEMORY VERSE: Love the LORD your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength. (Mark 12:30)

SCRIPTURE FOCUS: Exodus 20:3 / Matthew 19:16-30

1. **Who is the one who is good?** (God is the One who is good.)
2. **What are commandments?** (The things that the Bible instructs us to do.)
3. **Why do you think Jesus told the young man to obey the commandments to “enter life”?** (He may have testing the young man’s answer and what the young man thought his relationship with God was.)
4. **How did the young man answer?** (He told Jesus he had kept all those commandments, but he also asked what was still missing?)
5. **Do you think that he had obeyed every commandment? Why or Why not?** (Student Answer)
6. **How would you feel if Jesus told you to give up everything ?** (Student Answer)
7. **Why do you think that we should always put God first?** (God is Holy and perfect. He deserves first place in our lives. A relationship with God is worth much more than money or things. God is the only one who gives us all our possessions and we should not put anything above him.)

LESSON 2: The Ten Commandments

MEMORY VERSE: “You shall have no other gods before me.” (Exodus 20:3)

SCRIPTURE FOCUS: EXODUS 20

1. **What is the first commandment?** (“You shall have no other gods before me (Exodus 20:3.)
2. **What does it mean to have no other gods before God?** (Student Answer)
3. **How many commandments are found in Exodus 20? (10 commandments)**
4. **What is a commandment?** (Commandments are the rules that God has given us to follow.)
5. **Who did God give the 10 commandments to?** (Moses)

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6. **In Bible times an idol was a statute. What can an idol be in our times?** (An idol can be anything that we make more important than God.)

7. **Give an example of things that people make their idols?** (Student answer)

LESSON 3 – To Obey or Not to Obey? Get It Together

MEMORY VERSE: Listen, my son, to your father's instruction and do not forsake your mother's teaching. (Proverbs 1:8)

SCRIPTURE FOCUS: Exodus 20:12, Luke 2:41-52

1. What did Jesus do when Mary and Joseph started back home? **(He stayed in Jerusalem)**
2. **Why didn't his parents miss him right away?** (They thought He was with His extended family [cousins, aunts, uncles or friends].)
3. **How do you think Mary and Joseph felt while they were looking for him?** (Student answer)
4. **What was Jesus doing when they found him?** (He was in the temple courts, sitting with the teachers, listening to them and asking them questions)
5. **How was Jesus different from other 12 year olds?** (Jesus was God's son, so he was sinless)
6. **What caused the misunderstanding between Jesus and His parents?** (Scripture doesn't record that he told them he would be staying in the temple)
7. **What did Jesus show is the best way for children to respond to their parents' misunderstanding or conflict?** (Student Answer)

LESSON 4 – Rich and Foolish

MEMORY VERSE: Keep your lives from the love of money and be content with what you have. (Hebrews 13:5)

SCRIPTURE FOCUS: Exodus 20:15, 17, Luke 1:13-21

1. **What is a parable?** (A story that teaches a moral lesson.)
2. **What did Jesus tell the man and anyone else listening?** (That they should be on guard against greed; that life is not measured by how much they own)
3. **In the parable of the Rich and Foolish man, what was the man's attitude toward his riches?** (He was very content (happy with himself); he was sure he was set for life; he was proud.)

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4. **What happened to the rich man?** (He died and all of his possessions went to someone else.)
5. **What did Jesus mean being “rich toward God”?** (Valuing God more highly than anything or anyone else, especially money and material things.)
6. **How can we put God first in our lives and be rich toward God?** (Student answer)

LESSON 5 – Truthful Living

MEMORY VERSE: Speak the Truth to Each Other

SCRIPTURE FOCUS: EXODUS 20:16, JOHN 8:12-47

1. **What does it mean the truth will set you free?** (If we know Jesus we can be free from sin)
2. **Name a time when telling the truth as set you free?** (Student answer)
3. **What do you think Jesus meant by “the truth”?** (Not telling a lie)
4. **What is situational honesty?** (Basing your answer on the situation – sometimes not telling the whole truth.)
5. **Can you tell a half truth?** (A half-truth is a lie. We must tell the whole truth.)
6. **What happens when people lie?** (Each time they are asked about a situation, they may feel pressure and not remember what they said the first time.)
7. **What are some consequences of telling a lie?** (Student Answer)

LESSON 6 – Holy Encounter

MEMORY VERSE: Holy, holy, holy is the Lord Almighty; the whole earth is full of his glory. (Isaiah 6:3)

SCRIPTURE FOCUS: Isaiah 6:3

1. **How did Isaiah respond to what he saw?** (He was in awe)
2. **Why was Isaiah so frightened?** (Because he realized how sinful he was and thought he would die.)
3. **How did God help Isaiah?** (He had the angel place the hot coal on Isaiah’s mouth and told Isaiah his guilt is taken away and his sins atoned for. It is amazing to see that the hot coals did not burn Isaiah’s mouth.)

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4. **What did God ask?** (Whom shall I send?)
5. **How did Isaiah answer?** (Send me.)
6. **How would you have answered if God had asked you “Whom Shall I send?”**

LESSON 7 – Welcome Home (Parable of The Prodigal Son)

MEMORY VERSE: The Lord is slow to anger, abounding in love and forgiving sin and rebellion. (Numbers 14:18)

SCRIPTURE FOCUS: Luke 15:11-24

1. **What did the son do with his inheritance? (Luke 15:13)** (Spent all of his money and went to work for a pig keeper?)
2. **How do you think the son felt about his father after he lost everything?** (That he was kind because his Father’s servant had food to eat.)
3. **What did the son decide to do and why? (Luke 15:18-19)** (He decided to go to his father and ask for a job)
4. **How do you think the son felt about his father after he lost everything?** (That he was kind because his Father’s servant had food to eat.)
5. **What did the son decide to do and why? (Luke 15:18-19)** (He decided to go to his father and ask for a job)
6. **How was this father like God, our heavenly Father?** (God forgives us when we repent of sin and return to doing what He ask us to do.)
7. **What would you say to some who felt their sins were too big for God to forgive?**

LESSON 8 – A Changed Life – The Shake-up

MEMORY VERSE: Believe in the Lord Jesus, and you will be saved. (Acts 16:31)

SCRIPTURE FOCUS: Acts 16:25-34

1. **How did Paul and Silas spend their time in jail?** (They were praying and singing hymns to God. The others in the jail were listening to them.)
2. **How would you have spent your time in Jail?**

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3. **What happened while they were in jail?** (There was a violent earthquake and all the prison doors flew open and everyone's chain fell off.)
4. **What did the jailer think had happened?** (He thought all the prisoners had escaped and he would be killed)
5. **What was the jailer's question?** (Sirs, what must I do to be saved?)
6. **How did Paul answer?** (Believe in the Lord Jesus and you will be saved.)
7. **How do we know the jailer believed?** (He and his whole family were baptized.)
8. **What must we do to be saved?** (Believe in Jesus and be baptized.)

LESSON 9 – Growing in Faith

MEMORY VERSE: But grow in grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ (2 Peter 3:18)

SCRIPTURE FOCUS: Acts 16:1-3; 17:13-15; 1 & 2 Timothy

1. **How did some local Jews react to Paul's preaching?** (They stirred up crowds in Berea. They stirred up the crowd and caused a riot because of Paul's teachings about Jesus.)
2. **Why do you think Paul had to leave Berea?** (It was probably because of the riot and the people may have wanted to hurt him.)
3. What does 2 Timothy 1:7 mean - **For the Spirit God gave us does not make us timid, but gives us power, love and self-discipline.**
4. **How did Paul encourage Timothy to grow in faith?** (Paul told Timothy that he should continue living what he had learned since he was a child – the scriptures. The scriptures would be able to make him wise for salvation through faith in Christ.)
5. **How can you set an example for others?** (Student answer)
6. **How can Christians develop spiritual fitness?** (Reading and Studying the Bible, praying, worshiping God, serving God by serving others)

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LESSON 10 – Who's In Charge?

MEMORY VERSE: Let everyone be subject to the governing authorities, for there is no authority except that which God has established. (Romans 13:1)

SCRIPTURE FOCUS: Matthew 22:15-22

1. **What was the plan of the Pharisees and the Herodians?** (These enemies were working together to try and trap Jesus. They were sure they could get him in trouble with their question.)
2. **Do you think they (Pharisee and Herodians) believed what they were saying about Jesus?** (No. If they had, they wouldn't be trying to get Him in trouble. They would have honored him.)
3. **What do you think Jesus' choices were here?** (He could tell them to pay their taxes to Caesar or he could have told them not to pay taxes.)
4. **What might have happened if Jesus answered, no to their question?** (If he had answered "no" to their question, the Roman soldiers could arrest him for going against the government's authority.)
5. **Why do you think Jesus asked for a coin to answer the question?** (Jesus often used a physical object to make a point. Perhaps, He wanted them to see Caesar's picture on the coin to remind them that God wanted them to follow Caesar's authority.)
6. **What does Jesus' answer tell us about how we should live?** (God is our highest authority. We are always to honor God. But he puts people in authority over us. We are to honor and obey them because God allows them to have authority over us.)
7. **Give an example of a law or right that the governmental authorities have put in place that we must obey.** (Student answer)

LESSON 11 – The Cost of Greatness

MEMORY VERSE: Whoever wants to become great among you must be your servant, and whoever wants to be first must be a slave of all. (Mark 10:43-44)

SCRIPTURE FOCUS: Mark 10:38-45

1. **What does the word "great" mean to you?** (Student answer)
2. **What does it take to be a great person?** (Student answer)
3. **Describe in your own words what James and John wanted.** (They wanted to rule with Jesus in the places of honor – at Jesus' right and left.)

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4. **In your own words, explain Jesus' definition of greatness.** (People who are great serve and make sacrifices for others – to become great in the kingdom of God, we must serve others.)

5. **How does serving others make you great?** (When we do things for others, even when no one is looking, we are pleasing God. Pleasing God is all that matters.)
