## Spring 2023 REVIEW OUESTIONS

**Upper Elementary (Grades 3-6)** 

<u>LESSON 1</u>: "Trusting Jesus- Prayers and Trials" SCRIPTURE: Mark 14:32-65, Mark 15:16-18

MEMORY VERSE: All things are possible with God. Mark 10:27

- 1. Where did Jesus send the disciples? (Jesus sent them across the Sea of Galilee in a boat.)
- **2.** Why weren't the disciples able to go across the water? (The wind and the waves from a storm were pushing against them.)
- 3. How did Jesus go out to the disciples? (Jesus walked on the water to the disciples.)
- 4. What did Peter say to Jesus? ("Lord, tell me to come to You on the water.")
- 5. **What did Peter do?** (Peter climbed out of the boat. He trusted Jesus to help him walk on the water.)
- **6. What happened when Peter stopped trusting Jesus?** (Peter began to sink. He cried out to Jesus for help.)
- **7.** How did Jesus show He could be trusted even when Peter was sinking? (Jesus reached out to pull Peter up. Jesus helped Peter into the boat.)
- 8. Why did the disciples worship Jesus? (They worshiped Jesus because they understood more about the love and greatness of Jesus. They knew that they could trust Jesus.)
- **9.** What do you think Jesus wants us to trust Him for? (Students think and talk. They might suggest that Jesus wants us to trust Him when we are afraid when we need help, for things we need, and so on. Reinforce their appropriate ideas.)

LESSON 2: SCRIPTURE: MEMORY VERSE:

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**LESSON 3: "A Royal Promise Kept"** 

**SCRIPTURE: Matt 21:1-11** 

MEMORY VERSE: "Hosanna to the Son of David!" "Blessed is he who comes in the name

of the Lord!" "Hosanna in the highest heaven!" Matthew 21:9

- 1. What did Jesus ask the disciples to do? (Go into the village, untie a donkey and her colt, and bring them to Him.)
- 2. What is Jesus telling the people by riding into Jerusalem on a donkey? (That He is fulfilling the prophecy about the Messiah.)
- 3. Why do you think the story talks about a king riding a donkey? (The Messiah isn't coming to conquer the Romans. He is coming in peace.)
- 4. Who heard that Jesus was coming to Jerusalem? (A great crowd had come to Jerusalem for the Passover feast. People who followed Jesus knew He was there as well as people who had heard about Jesus and His miracles.)
- 5. Why do you think the crowd was so excited to see Jesus? (Many people had heard of many miracles that He done and wanted to honor Jesus as the great conqueror. They also were looking for a Messiah to free them from the Roman government. They didn't recognize that Jesus was the son of God, who had come to save the world.)

**LESSON 4: "The Servant Call"** 

SCRIPTURE: John 13:1-17, 14:15-31

**MEMORY VERSE:** 

- 1. Now that you know what it means to wash feet, **What was Peter's reaction to Jesus washing his feet?** (Surprised because the washing of the feet was for the servants who would welcome guest.)
- 2. What did Jesus tell Peter? (Jesus told him he had to do it. If not, he could not be with him.)
- 3. What feast was being celebrated when they met at the Upper Room? (Passover.)
- 4. How do we serve others? Kind deeds for others? What about students that get bullied? (Student's answer.)

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**LESSON 5: "Before and After"** 

SCRIPTURE: Matthew 26:23-25, 31-35, 57-75, John 21:15-17

**FOCUS**: Jesus shows us that failure isn't fatal.

<u>MEMORY VERSE</u>: "The Lord is compassionate and gracious, slow to anger,

abounding in love." (Psalm 103:8)

- 1. **How did Jesus identify his betrayer?** (He said the one who dipped his hand into the bowl with Him would betray Him. Matt 26:23-25)
- 2. What did Jesus say Peter would do before the rooster crowed three times in the morning? (Peter would say he didn't know Jesus; he would disown Jesus. Matt 26:31-35)
- 3. Why do you think Peter said he didn't know Jesus? (He was afraid he would go to jail for believing in Jesus.)
- 4. What do you think went through Peter's mind when Jesus looked at him? (Peter probably felt terrible about betraying Jesus. And, Peter remembered that Jesus predicted that he would betray Him.)
- 5. What do you think Peter learned from these events? (Even if we betray Jesus, He is merciful and forgiving when we repent. Failure on our part, sin that we confess, cannot separate us from God's love and protection.)
